We Mary Elizabeth Howck, wife of Louis Howck, husband and father, do hereby declare this to be a true and correct copy of our by-laws and subdivision of parts of Out Lots 47 & 48 in the City of Cape Girardeau in Cape Girardeau County, Missouri and we do hereby dedicate to the Public forever the street named 'College', 'Middle' & 'Decatur' as hereinafter described. It is however expressly understood that the tract tinted red, as marked, reserved to M. B. Howck lying between the river & lots 1, 2 & 3 is reserved absolutely to Mary Elizabeth Howck, her heirs & assigns; and should the soil by any changes of the river be carried away and again replaced, it is to belong to her, or not to the shores of said lots. And the spaces tinted red, on each side of the ditch, is also reserved to her. Witness our hands & seals, this 7th day of December, 1892.
