Why Bicycle Registration:

Registering your bicycle is a way to ensure that if your bicycle is stolen, it is returned to you. Otherwise, bicycles for which the owner cannot be determined are entered into found property and sold in an annual auction.

The Bicycle Registration Process:

You can register your bicycle with the Cape Girardeau Police Department Monday through Friday, 8:00 to 5:00 p.m., by contacting the Community Service Officers and setting up a time to register your bicycle. Community Service Officers may be reached at 573-339-6621 ext. 1243 or 1290.

When registering your bicycle, you will need to bring your identification and bicycle to the Police Department. Officers will note your information along with the identifying information for your bicycle. This information will be entered into a department bicycle registration database. A bicycle registration sticker with an identifying number will be placed on your bicycle by the officer. This number is your registration number.

To speed up the process, you can print out the registration form from the Police Department's bicycle registration web page, and then bring the completed form along with your bicycle at the time you register your bicycle.

If Your Bicycle Is Stolen:

Contact the Police Department and provide them with your name and bicycle registration number. The officer can research this information and have all the information he or she needs to complete the necessary report. If your bicycle is located you will be notified and asked to retrieve it from the Police Department. If you do not have your bicycle registered, then you should then provide the officer the identifying information for your bicycle along with your identifying information, and make arrangements to register your bicycle immediately. When taking the report, the officer will provide you with a report number. Keep this number for future reference.
