CAPAHA LAGOON IMPROVEMENTS

The lagoon at Capaha Park is in need of long-term maintenance and improvement. Sediment has built up in the lagoon making it shallow, which is bad for the fish and waterfowl in the park. It also impedes its function as a stormwater detention facility. There are also some areas of the park that need localized improvements for stormwater runoff to improve the usefulness of the areas.

The improvement will install a fore bay at the north end of the lagoon, dredge out the sediments, and clean up the lagoon perimeter. This will provide needed stormwater detention capacity and improve the water quality for park users and wildlife in the park. The various localized areas may be graded and have pipes installed to improve the stormwater runoff. The estimated cost is \$750,000.

Upgraded street crossings at:

The size of the culvert or box culvert will be increased to provide a higher capacity for stormwater runoff.
