1. Call to Order

The Liquor License Review Board convened on Wednesday, November 20, 2013, at 3:30 p.m. with Chief Review Officer Mr. Ryan Shrimplin presiding and Board Members Mrs. Carol Peters and Mr. Charles Wagoner present.

2. Introduction and Opening Comments

Mr. Ryan Shrimplin introduced the members of the Board and reviewed the agenda items and meeting format.

3. Approval of April 8, 2013 minutes

A Motion was made by Carol Peters, seconded by Charles Wagoner to approve. Motion approved. 3-0. Aye, Peters, Shrimplin, Wagoner.

4. Review of approval and appeal of liquor license for That One Bar, 36 North Spanish Street

a. Public Comments

Mr. Loyd Ervin, of 115 Themis Street, appeared and said that he lived there with his daughter before he moved. He said that he did not have problems with cigarette smoke before that location became a bar. He said that the smoke is worse when the bar has a busy night, and better when they are having a slow night. Mr. Ervin said that his daughter has health concerns that are aggravated by the smoke problems, and they are looking into pressurizing the building to prevent smoke from entering residence.

b. Applicant Comments

Mr. Jeff Koenig, Manager of THAT ONE BAR, appeared and said that he had hired Dutch Enterprises to look over the bar’s exhaust system and they had installed the most expensive filters they had, in an attempt to satisfy Mr. Ervin’s concerns.



c. City Staff Comments

Mr. Tim Morgan, Chief Review Officer, appeared and said that he had visited Mr. Ervin's home and business, ERVIN'S METALSMITHS, at 115 Themis Street and he could smell the obvious odor of cigarette smoke in one room. THAT ONE BAR was not open for business at the time of his visit.

Mr. Morgan said that he and Dutch Enterprises had discussed ways to prevent the odor of cigarette smoke from entering Mr. Ervin's home and business. Dutch Enterprises recommended that Mr. Ervin cap the vent stacks on the roof. Mr. Ervin had said that he was unsure of the function or purpose of the vents. Dutch Enterprises indicated that they found no obvious vent to exhaust air from THAT ONE BAR and likened the bar's lack of vents to a balloon that leaks air to equalize pressure.

Mr. Daniel Grim, attorney for Mr. Rick Werner, the building owner, appeared and asked where the smell of smoke was coming from, since THAT ONE BAR was closed at the time of Mr. Morgan's visit to 115 Themis Street.

Mr. Ervin reappeared and said that the odor of cigarette smoke is light when the bar has a small crowd, but when the crowd at the bar is heavier, the smell is thicker. Mr. Shrimplin asked if Mr. Ervin could see the smoke on those nights. Mr. Ervin replied that the odor has woken his family from sleep and that they can taste it in the air. Mrs. Peters asked if another neighboring bar, LODOS, also had a large crowd on those nights when the smell of smoke was strong.

Mr. Rick Werner, the building owner, addressed the Board and denied that the odor of cigarette smoke is stronger when the crowd is heavier. He said that in one instance, Mr. Ervin called him and complained that the smell of smoke was particularly heavy, just after he had spoken to Mr. Koenig on the phone, who had complained of a particularly slow night at the bar.

d. Board review, discussion, and possible action

Mr. Wagoner remarked that the smoke has to be coming from some place, and he would really like to see something happen to help relieve Mr. Ervin's concerns. Mr. Shrimplin replied that all the Board can do is enforce the existing codes. Until now, it was understood that THAT ONE BAR was following the codes as written – however, some of those codes regarding ventilation issues may need to be addressed.

Mr. Shrimplin said that this issue will arise in cities that do not have a smoking ban in force, and the downtown area is different from other areas in Cape Girardeau. Unfortunately, you can't escape this situation entirely, no matter what is done, since the odor of cigarette smoke is probably coming from more than one source. He said that the Board will need to continue to monitor the situation.



Ms. Holloway:

I am writing to formally appeal the suspension of my liquor license at 612 South Sprigg Street. As a company we work hard to screen our applicants before being hired so that they do not have any prior offenses of record. Further, each applicant is required to pass a drug test before being hired. Once a decision is made to hire, each person goes through a training process and testing for Techniques of Alcohol Management and CAST (Certified Alcohol Sales Training), two sales training course sponsored by our National Association of Convenience Stores (NACS). We also include a We Card video that incorporates alcohol and tobacco sales training. Follow up training is performed through my company being a regular attendant in the city sponsored training seminars that occur periodically. I pay my employees to attend these city sponsored training opportunities. My company also conducts its own compliance checks through the BARS program that we pay for to make sure our sales associates are asking for ID and we reward for with a passing grade. I would challenge the board to find another convenience store that puts this much effort into their training.

I had purposely delayed writing this letter to first have a meeting with Chief Blair. Due to the unfortunate death of Roger Fields, this meeting had to be delayed until Friday, April 11<sup>th</sup>. At this meeting I had a good discussion with Chief Blair and other officers of the Cape Girardeau Police Department. Clearly, our store at 612 South Sprigg has an issue with passing compliance checks. We have done a good job under the BARS program and the sales associate that was terminated due to the failure of this specific compliance check received a passing grade from BARS just 4 days prior. I went over in detail our current training and follow up training with the members of the police department in our meeting. They were all impressed with our level of training and importance that we place on this issue. However, I did receive some good input from this meeting that I will be implementing to further increase awareness on this issue. Specifically, Officer Couch will be attending our weekly manager meetings every other month to go over properly checking ID's and evaluating the procedure to make sure we are stressing this at our stores. Our policy will remain that we card everybody regardless of age. In addition, we will be including the We Card compliance checks to our store locations to have two separate compliance checks performed each month for alcohol sales, one by BARS and one by We Card. Follow up training will be conducted at store level with a WE Card training video with passing test score quarterly and continued attendance to the city sponsored ID classes. Finally, it is our policy to terminate anyone who fails a compliance check and we will continue to enforce this. However, I am also implementing fines and penalties, including termination for each store manager. One failed compliance check is a \$500 loss of commission net, two fails is \$1,000 commission loss, and three fails is a week suspension without pay and loss of commission sales for that week of suspension. Four failures in 12 months of time will be a termination of employment. This is a very important issue that must be stressed upon heavily to the store manager and sales staff to be of the utmost importance. I have also switched insurance carriers to which my new carrier will be conducting an annual ID seminar and compliance review with our staff.

These failures are a reflection to the type of operation I am running as a business. These failures at this location are not reflective of our entire operation, but of this specific store. Clearly, we do a lot to screen, train, and follow up with each sales associate to make sure they are doing their jobs. But, the failures in checks show we need to evaluate and better enforce the policies that we have implemented. I feel after meeting with the Cape Girardeau Police Department that we have a good game plan and more consistent training and enforcement of policy moving forward.

I am very sorry for this situation and embarrassed for me and my company. My family has been doing business in Cape Girardeau for over 70 years. This penalty is a reflection that affects me personally. I will work hard to make sure we are doing all we can to pass these compliance checks. I am happy to provide follow up progress reports and information on our continued follow up training and cooperation with the Cape PD to provide on-site training to you and your board. Further, I would offer up funding the current grant funded compliance checks in order to provide for more compliance checks, more often. I want to do my part as a business owner and citizen to keep alcohol out of minor's possession. I look forward to discussing any and all of this.





**MEETING MINUTES**

February 13, 2013

Present: Heather Brooks, Assistant City Manager; Anna Kangas, Plan Reviewer;  
Charles "Speedy" Wagoner

City Staff Present: Lt. Barry Hovis, Police Department

Call to Order

Heather Brooks called the meeting to order at 4:00 p.m.

Introduction and Opening Comments

Ms. Brooks introduced the Board and explained the rules of order for addressing the Board.

Approval of Minutes

The minutes of the August 31, 2012 meeting were unanimously approved upon motion made by Ms. Brooks and seconded by Mr. Wagoner.

COMMENTS, DISCUSSION & VOTING

**Review of appeal of recommended suspension of Amerimart #7, 1320 W. Cape Rock**

- a. Ms. Brooks called for Public Comment from the floor. Seeing none;
- b. Ms. Brooks called for Applicant Comment.  
Beth Bollinger, Administrative Manager for Midwest Energy addressed the Board. Ms. Bollinger presented information about the company's employee policy and employee training and the details regarding the incidents cited regarding the suspension. Ms. Bollinger continued by describing steps that the company had taken to improve employee compliance to liquor sale laws.
- c. Ms. Brooks asked City Police Department Lt. Barry Hovis to take the floor to clarify or explain the compliance check process and the recommendation for suspension and the communication with the licensee.  
The Board reviewed and discussed information provided. Mr. Wagoner and Ms. Brooks addressed Ms. Bollinger concerning the company's challenge and responsibility to have employees comply with the laws and commended efforts to improve but that the Board stated that the history of violations had to be considered.  
Ms. Brooks called for the question. Mr. Wagoner motioned to uphold the suspension. Ms. Brooks seconded. The vote was unanimous.

Ms. Brooks advised all appealing businesses that if the Board upholds the recommended suspension, a suspension letter would be sent to the business documenting the vote and that the suspension would be effective March 1, 2013.

**Review of appeal of recommended suspension of Southern Convenience Stores, 612 S. Sprigg Street**

- a. Ms. Brooks called for Public Comment from the floor. Seeing none;
- b. Ms. Brooks called for Applicant Comment.  
Mr. Scott Blank, owner of Bi-State Oil Company operator Southern Convenience Store addressed the Board. Mr. Blank presented information about the company's employee policy and employee training and his request to meet with interim Police Chief Fields. Mr. Blank continued by describing steps that the company had taken to improve employee compliance to liquor sale laws.
- c. The Board reviewed and discussed information provided. The Board commended Mr. Blank on his steps to ensure compliance, but also felt the number of violations warranted action. Ms. Brooks called for the question. Ms. Kangas motioned to uphold the suspension. Ms. Brooks seconded. The vote was unanimous.

**Review of appeal of recommended suspension of Slingers Nightclub and Lounge, 820 N. Sprigg Street, Ste. 6**

- a. Ms. Brooks called for Public Comment from the floor. Seeing none;
- b. Ms. Brooks called for Applicant Comment.  
Attorney John Harding representing Slingers Nightclub and owner Shaun Langford addressed the Board. Mr. Harding stated that his client's business should not be penalized for the criminal acts of others. Mr. Harding further explained that in two incidents leading to the recommendation for suspension that the club's employees performed their legal obligation of checking the patrons' identifications and that the patrons had used fake IDs. Concerning these incidents, Mr. Harding stated that his client had asked police officers for advice to prevent this. Mr. Harding continued by describing another incident with an underage patron. Mr. Harding stated that at that time the business allowed 18 year old and older patrons into the bar and that the employees had not served this individual and that legal aged adults had provided the alcohol to the underage drinker. Mr. Harding then told the Board that the business changed its policy and no longer allows patrons under 21 years old and has started using an UV light to check IDs. Mr. Harding declared to the Board that a suspension would close the business and petitioned the Board to overturn the decision or change the penalty because the suspension recommendation was caused by third-party activities.  
Mr. Shaun Langford, owner and operator of Slingers addressed the Board. Mr. Langford reiterated the statements of Mr. Harding and declared he believed to have a good reputation and worked well with the Police Department. He ended with a plea to overturn the recommendation for suspension.
- c. The Board reviewed and discussed information provided. Mr. Wagoner directed comments to Mr. Langford concerning several police responses to the business location and stated that Mr. Langford was responsible for the activities on the premises including on the parking lot. In response to questions from Board member Ms. Brooks, Mr. Langford indicated that the UV light was implemented in late November or early December and during the period that 18-year olds were allowed in the business that they were identified with a bracelet and ink marking system. Ms. Brooks added that business practice of allowing underage patrons makes the business responsible. Ms. Brooks also stated that she found the levels of intoxication and number of police calls troubling (over 40 in one year); adding the number of police calls could be found to be a nuisance violation as well. Ms. Brooks went on to acknowledge that this nightclub review was

different than the earlier reviews of the convenience stores and that a suspension would have a different impact on a nightclub.

Ms. Brooks called for the question. Mr. Wagoner motioned to uphold the suspension. Ms. Brooks seconded. The vote was unanimous.

Adjournment

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned at 4:55 p.m.
