

The Cape Girardeau Parks and Recreation Department have set the following guidelines for trail use. These guidelines are intended to make the trail as safe as possible for all users.

NO MOTORIZED VEHICLES

1. Trail open from Dawn to Dusk
2. Use trail for intended purposes only: Walking, Running, Biking, Rollerblading
3. Obey posted signs
4. Stay to the right except when passing
5. Travel at a safe speed and alert others when passing
6. Yield to oncoming traffic
7. Stay on paved surfaces
8. Use caution at street/bridge crossings and at underpasses
9. If trail is under water, DO NOT CROSS
10. Please keep trail clean: Use trash receptacles
11. Please clean up after your pet; keep pets on a leash

Route W / Lexington to Cape Woods Restroom	.60 Miles
Cape Woods Restroom to Hopper Road Bridge	.37 Miles
Hopper Road Bridge to Rodney Street Bridge	1.10 Miles
Rodney Street Bridge to Independence Street Bridge	.42 Miles
Independence Street Bridge to William Street Bridge	.27 Miles
William Street Bridge to Bloomfield Road Bridge	.47 Miles
Bloomfield Road Bridge to Brink Street Access	.22 Miles
Brink Street Access to Shawnee Park Soccer Field Bridge	.97 Miles
Total:	5.67 Miles

White Stripes = 1/10th mile increments

Yellow Stripes = 1/4th mile increments

Riverfront Park Walkway (from end to end)	1.25 Miles
Sidewalk around Capaha Park	.90 Miles
Sidewalk around Capaha Pond	.28 Miles

CAPE LACROIX RECREATION TRAIL



The Cape LaCroix Recreation Trail is a project that will improve recreational opportunities for the citizens of Cape Girardeau. Citizens may benefit by using the trail for walking, running, cycling, rollerblading, skating, or skate boarding. The trail provides a travel corridor from Shawnee Park through the City of Cape Girardeau to Osage Park. This project was made possible through funding from the City of Cape Girardeau and the State of Missouri. Construction of the trail commenced in 1993 and the final segment of the original planned trail completed in 1999.
